Well done to our Cross Country runners who finally got the chance to run after 4 postponements due to the weather! Results should be out in the next newsletter..

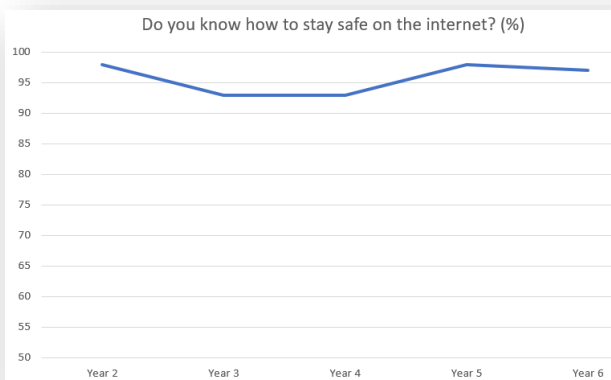

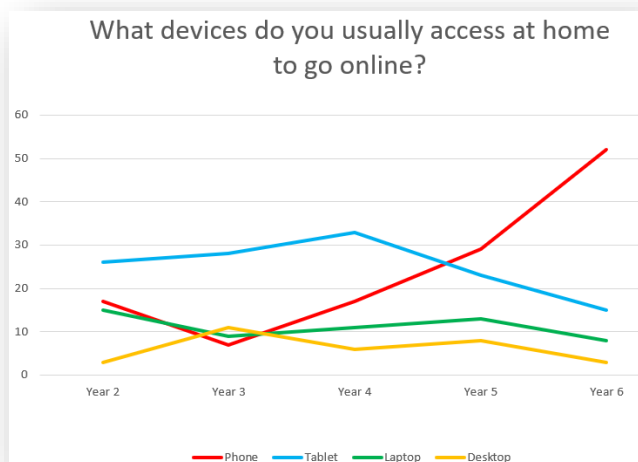
INTERNET SAFETY SURVEY

During internet safety week, before half term we collected our children's perceptions about the internet and also captured some details about their ever changing online habits.

Firstly, a large majority of our children say they know how to stay safe online. This is good in terms of reflecting the message we repeat during the curriculum, but not borne out in children's behaviours which we are regularly dealing with. Children are vulnerable and may think one way and act another.



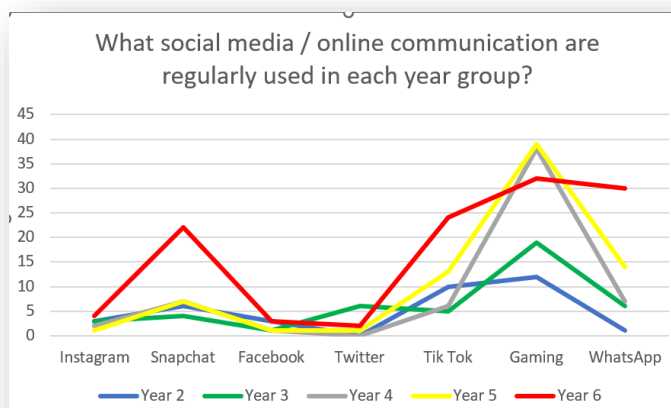
We asked our children how they access the online world. They reflect that less than half of our Year 5 children mainly use a mobile phone, increasing to almost all of Year 6.



It also reflects that a significant number of Year 2 children may be accessing an adults phone to go online.

It is crucial, therefore, to think about appropriate settings—especially when younger children are accessing an adults phone.

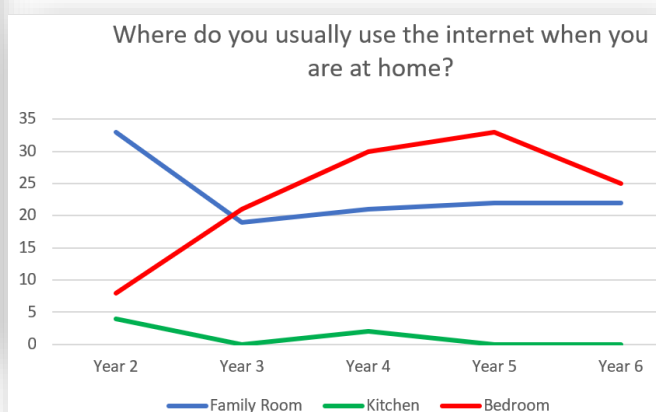
For the Year 5 and 6 children, please check the phone's settings—are "content and privacy settings" correctly managed. Does the child have access to unfiltered internet?



Current trends in children's online habits remain similar to last year. The current Year 6 are regular users of WhatsApp, with some use of Tik Tok and Snapchat, but this isn't most children.

When children suggest that they are the only ones who don't access certain options, you can see that this isn't the case.

Online gaming continues to be the most common means for online communication—online games are targeted by criminals and evidence shows that they approach all gaming platforms. We reiterate regularly at school that children shouldn't allow unfamiliar contacts to join them online—however, this is a common occurrence and we remind parents of the importance of open conversations and dialogue about what is happening online and who they are talking to.



A lot of children reported that they go online in a private place, like a bedroom—we strongly advise that to help parents stay aware of online activities, that they operate openly where parents / guardians can monitor their activities.

We recommend open conversations and a shared interest in what children are doing online.

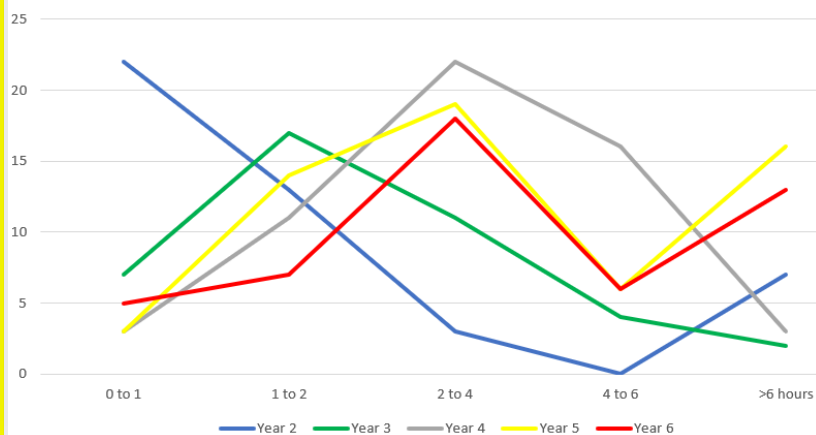

How much time do children think they spend each day on the internet at home?



With the national coverage of children's online habits last week, it was made clear that many children were spending long periods online—and "on-screen".

This can have a poor effect on health and eye-sight, if children spend too long in front of a device.

In school we always talk about the importance of balance and having quality family time, or outdoor time—a break away from the devices.

We really recommend setting limits to children's online habits. The graph shows us that some children suggest they are spending over 6 hours a day, out of school time online.
